New Bank Construction

We have been watching the demolition of the home and Quonset hut at the corner of High Point and Mineral Point Roads. Per the City Assessor, the property was sold in May 2020 from the Polich Estate to Associated Bank for \$1,100,000. They are constructing a two-story building on the corner with parking and detached drive-through banking lanes on the east and north sections of the property

Pheasant Branch Watershed Study

The City Engineering Department held a virtual public information meeting on June 18, 2020. A recording of the presentation, story maps and the PowerPoint presentation are available on the Engineering website:

The preliminary computer model shows results for a storm that has a 1% chance of occurring annually. The map shows Tamarack would be impacted on Randolph, Tree Lane, the west end of Cedar Creek and at Westfield near the clubhouse.

Clubhouse Lobby Open

The clubhouse lobby is open to post or look at any advertisements on the bulletin board. Face mask coverings are required to enter and stay 6 feet apart while in the lobby area.

When is the next election?

A Partisan Primary Election will be held on August 11. You may preview your ballot by visiting the website myvote.wi.gov. Click on "What's On My Ballot" and enter your address.

Myvote.wi.gov is an excellent source of information about elections and voting. You may also obtain information from the City Clerk's Office at clerk@cityofmadison.com or 266-4601.

Where do I go to vote?

For purposes of voting, Westfield Road and Tree Lane are dividing lines for Tamarack Trails residents.

- If you live south of Tree Lane <u>or</u> east of Westfield Road, your polling place is the Lussier Community Education Center, 55 S. Gammon Rd. in Madison.
- If you live north of Tree Lane <u>and</u> west of Westfield Road, your polling place is High Point Church, 7702 Old Sauk Rd. in Madison.

You must vote at your assigned location on Election Day. However, if you wish to vote early (July 28 to August 8), you may cast an **in-person absentee ballot** at Alicia Ashman Library, 733 N. High Point Road, Madison.

If you wish to vote by **mail-in absentee ballot**, you have two options:

- Request an absentee ballot by choosing "Vote Absentee" on the <u>myvote.wi.gov</u> website. You can do so for the remaining elections in 2020 (August 11 and November 3). You may make a new request every year
- Request an absentee ballot by following the instructions on the City Clerk's website. Go to: City of Madison > Clerk > Elections & Voting > Vote Absentee > Absentee Delivery by Mail. Requests must be received in the Clerk's Office by 5:00 PM on the Thursday before the Tuesday election. Completed absentee ballots must be received in the Clerk's Office by Election Day.

Food Pantry Update
