## Nomination and Elections

Dear Tamarack Trails Owners,

The Annual Meeting of Members and the Election of Directors is scheduled for **Tuesday**, **October 26**<sup>th</sup>. The Board of Directors (BOD) appointed Tamarack Trails Owners Harry Miles, Joan Lerman, Sharon Genthe and Jayne Meyer to the Nominations and Elections Committee (NEC) this year. They will work with outgoing BOD Vice-President Amy Kell to supervise the nomination and election of four Directors for twoyear terms.

The job of the NEC is to solicit and identify the slate of candidates for the Board of Directors. **The NEC does not vet candidates.** 

Tamarack Trails Members who are interested in running for the BOD must:

Be a Tamarack Member (Owner) and must be current with their fees and assessments

- Respond in writing to questions posed by the NEC about their background and experience as well as their views of the important issues facing Tamarack Trails, and how they would work to resolve them
- Submit a photo of themselves (a selfie is fine), which will be distributed to all Members with the candidate's responses to the questions prior to the election

The NEC is planning to host a low-key Meet the Candidate event at the Clubhouse in October prior to the election.

In October, you will receive paper ballots where you can vote for the candidates of your choice, along with instructions to return completed ballots to the Clubhouse at least two days before the election. The ballots will be counted by the NEC and results will be reported to the community at the Annual Meeting.

**We encourage you to consider running for the Board of Directors this year.** We need your involvement! BOD work is important work for our community and your voice could help shape the direction of Tamarack Trails for years to come.

Tamarack Trails Nominations and Election Committee

#### Property Insurance Coverage

For the last few years, Acuity has been our insurance carrier. This spring, we received a letter from them stating that they were not going to renew our policy.

More than 20 carriers declined to provide us with quotes for a variety of reasons: age (over 30 years), wood frame construction, no sprinkler systems or total insured value over \$20 million.

Thanks to the hard work of M3 Insurance Solutions, our new insurance carrier will be Auto-Owners Insurance Group, effective September 1st. Established in 1916, they are headquartered in Lansing, Michigan and are rated A++ by AM Best Company.

The annual premium for our general insurance which covers liability, trucks, workers compensation, etc., will incur an increase of \$78. Unfortunately, our property insurance has a whopping annual increase of 60.8% which amounts to \$81,541.

To minimize the negative effects of this large increase, the Board of Directors has opted to pay the annual premium in full, rather than monthly. While this payment option requires a lump sum payout of \$220,416, it will provide us with a discount of \$21,636. To cover this expense, we will use \$47,774 budgeted for insurance from September-December 2021, \$141,120 from the money market account and \$31,522 from the contingency fund. Fortunately, the Association is in great shape financially. Thanks to the hard work and due diligence of the Finance Committee, we will still be ahead of our 30-year financial projections.

I would like to update you of our maintenance schedules for August 2021 through September 30, 2021. Exterior painting for all of Millstone and 2,4 and 6 Oak Creek are to be completed by August 30<sup>th</sup> weather permitting. Along with our normal routine of work orders and the closing of the pool on September 26<sup>th</sup> weather permitting.

A total of three decks will be completed by September 30th.Trim replacement along with foundation coverings and chimney caps to be pursued in phase 5 starting September 27th.

As a reminder:

- Ensure your car doors and all doors to your residence are kept locked.
- Leave exterior residence lights on at night or utilize motion detecting lights.

- Removing valuables from your car is better than hiding them. This includes garage door openers and spare keys.
- Keep your garage door closed and double-check it is closed at night.
- Report all criminal and suspicious activity immediately.

#### NO SPRAY LIST

On or about Labor Day, Maple Leaf will be applying a granular fertilizer and a liquid herbicide to the lawns at Tamarack. If you would prefer that the area around your residence not receive the herbicide application, you can sign up for the "No Spray List" by contacting Angie Swan by August 30<sup>th</sup>.

When herbicides are not used, the flowers that feed pollinators such as bees and butterflies have a chance to grow. And by reducing our use of chemicals, we lower the risk of long-term negative health and environment impacts on our Tamarack and Madison communities.

Reducing Tamarack's use of pesticides is one of the goals of *Neighbors for a Greener Tamarack*, a work group sponsored by the Maintenance Committee. The group ran the 2021 No-Mow-May (NMM) demonstration project this past spring. A summary of the results was published in the June Good Life.

The NMM project combined the goal of providing food for pollinators during the month of May with reduced pesticide use at the NMM test site. The group plans to propose one or more additional NMM test sites – for 2022 - for board approval in the coming months.
