Planting a Blue and Gold Blooming Pallet

in Celebration of Tamarack's 50th Anniversary

You, too, can do your part in celebrating community pride by this year selecting your annual flowers to match the Blue and Gold 50th Anniversary colors.

As you've read, the 50th Anniversary Planning Committee hopes to plan one event per month during 2024. But just think of a pallet of blue and gold blooms throughout our community -- on your unit lot, in hanging baskets, or in colorful pots. These plantings could create a sense of community pride over the season and give residents, family, and visitors a reason to stroll around the trails and reflect on the changes that have taken place in the past 50 years.

Now is the time to start some flowers from seed or take an inventory of the flowerpots needing TLC before choosing what to plant. So, to jump start your next trip to the local nursery, here's a short list of annuals that you may wish to consider: dwarf morning glory, marigolds, lobelia, verbena, straw flower, sweet alyssum, (miniature) sunflower, nasturtiums, snapdragon, ageratum, celosia, coleus, moss rose, viola, zinnia, and rudbeckia.

And for those residents developing perennial gardens, here are some native species to consider: false indigo, clematis, English lavender, black-eyed Susan, coneflower, butterfly weed, columbine and coreopsis. Walking around Tamarack could be like we're having our own Flower Festival! We hope you will join in and encourage others to add some colorful blooms and become a part of our 50th Anniversary. **Let's Get Growing!**



The **logo concept** was presented to the Board of Directors for approval at their March 26th meeting and was approved! Many


thanks to Christina for her time, effort, persistence, and talent for making the 50th Anniversary Logo a reality!

Board Meeting Notes - March 26, 2024

This is an informal report about the regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors. Official minutes will be posted on the Tamarack website after approval by the Board.

All Board members (Steinbach, Jesien, Larson, G. White, Findley, Foley and J. Meyer) and Association Manager Haberman were present. Twenty-seven residents attended in person or by Zoom.

Haberman reported:


- Tamarack received \$4,795 Workers Compensation from Rural Mutual Insurance for being claim-free for year and reduced wages paid.
- The annual business audit will be conducted April 10-12.
- Poblocki Paving Corp. agreed to honor March 2023 contract pricing for phase 2 of Oak Creek Trail (units 50-82) asphalt replacement.
- "Bob," new Maintenance Supervisor has started; still recruiting for Maintenance Tech.

Board of Directors approved:

- Nominations of Deborah Powers Chritton and Barrett Karabis for Architectural Review Board, Peggy Siebers and Julia Heusinger for Garden Committee, and Becky Oaks for Welcoming Committee.
- Logo concept from 50th Anniversary Committee for use during anniversary year.
- Contract with Badger Swimpools, Inc., to build new swimming pool.
- Three-minute time limit for input from individual residents at board meeting, subject to exceptions.
- Letter to Alder Nikki Conklin to thank her for meeting with Steinbach, Foley, and Meyer and to reiterate Tamarack's concerns about proposed greenway restoration.

"Mow less, spray less, plant more natives."

Spring No Blow Proposal Presented to the Maintenance Committee and Board

For the past two fall contractor leaf cleanups, NGT has assisted residents who wanted the leaves left on their flower beds to overwinter by delineating these areas with WHITE flags. These flags must be placed on all developed or mulched beds in your yard; you can no longer choose which beds. The white flagging indicated to the contractor NOT TO BLOW those designated areas. In February, the NGT proposal included expanding the NO BLOW project to include the vendor's spring leaf clean-up and was presented to both the Maintenance Committee and Board. Both groups were in agreement with the process and approved of our efforts to educate residents on the benefits of leaving the leaves to add nutrients to the soil, food for overwintering insects, and suppressing weeds. **A copy of the proposal will be available for pick up and is also posted on the clubhouse bulletin board for your review.**

Even if you participated in the past, all residents wishing to be included this year MUST sign up for the No Blow project; contact the Office (note in email subject line NO BLOW). Also, watch for additional information on the Bulletin Board, dropped at your doorstep, a visit from your NGT representative or via an email blast. Thank you to all who have supported this effort and made it so successful.

No Mow May/Low Mow May

Let's take a moment to ask ourselves: <u>What is the Point of No Mow May or Low Mow May</u> <u>anyway?</u> The overall goal is simple—take a break from early mowing to allow flowers to bloom, delay chemical spraying, and help feed the pollinators. Here at Tamarack, that "break" also gives some areas with heavily compacted soil a break from the heavy mowing equipment and allows some of the early rains to infiltrate down below the soil surface. The sites chosen are either No Mow or Low Mow for May; no mow is just that – no mowers will mow at all in May in the designated areas. The low mow areas will be <u>mowed once</u> during the month of May. The NGT Site Organizers are responsible for obtaining unit resident consent, determining area boundaries, and placing the BLUE flagging before the vendor is scheduled to mow. Again, NGT signage and Info Boxes will be out for you to find the sites and pick up informational materials. **The 10 sites this year are:**
